



What a Year!

Through your donations, coordination and encouragement, every student at All Saints was able to experience the gift of giving benefitting over **20** local agencies. During the 2015-2016 school year, students have connected with nonprofits and people of all ages in many ways:

***Pre-K** recycled **215** pounds of batteries*

***Kindergarten** shipped **50** pounds of candy, socks and coffee to U.S. troops in Afghanistan through Mission Mahalo; created **56** placemats in November for veterans at the VA Hospital; made **65** valentines for seniors at Laurelhurst Village; and delivered May Day flowers to neighborhood homes near All Saints*

***First grade** gave **175** toys to Randall Children's Hospital and collected **1,429** snacks for families staying at Ronald McDonald House*

***Second grade** collected **1,600** books for Children's Book Bank and collected **\$833** through "Chloe's Crusaders" supporting Cystic Fibrosis research*

***Third grade** gave **520** hand-written, personalized letters and spent **15** hours visiting with and singing to Laurelhurst Village residents*

***Fourth grade** sold **222** Mission: Hungry Helping Packs and processed **10,465** pounds of oranges for and donated **\$1,110** to Oregon Food Bank*

Fifth grade provided **900** pounds of hygiene supplies and **275** items of clothing for Northwest Children's Outreach; and **465** articles of clothing to Project Lemonade

Sixth grade spent **710** hours visiting with friends at Providence's Center for Medically Fragile Children

Seventh grade gave **365 hours** of service, donated **more than \$4,000** and collected **65 bags** of donated items for **16** agencies that include: Alex's Lemonade Stand, Clackamas County Dog Service, Crib Project, Free Geek, Providence Easter Party, Children's Book Bank, PAW Team, Library Outreach Services, Hacienda CDC, Pongo Fund, Randall Children's Hospital, Theater Means Bright, Community Transitional School, Ronald McDonald House. They also worked to remove graffiti and feed the homeless in partnership with a number of local organizations

Eighth grade gathered **10,000** cans for St. Vincent de Paul

All grades and their families worked together and: made over **450** lunches for the Catholic Charities Housing Transitions Program; raised **\$5,465** for Cystic Fibrosis research; "adopted" an Eritrean **family of five** and an Iraqi **family of three** through Catholic Charities Refugee Giving Tree program, providing food, clothing, laptops, bedding, dishes and vacuum cleaners; and collected **\$2,231** for the Lenten Rice Bowl Project
