Friends of the Earth

Pre-K recycled 300 pounds of batteries

Kindergarten shipped 60 pounds of candy, socks and coffee to U.S. troops in Afghanistan through Mission Mahalo; created placemats for Portland VA Medical Center patients in November; made valentines for Laurelhurst Village residents; and delivered May Day flowers to neighborhood homes near All Saints

First grade gave **200** toy prizes to Randall Children's Hospital BINGO Program and collected **200** toys and art supplies for families staying at Ronald McDonald House

Second grade collected **1,505** books for Children's Book Bank

Third grade gave **600** hand-written, personalized letters to Laurelhurst Village residents, a nearby senior living facility

Monthly deliveries from our third grade brightened the lives of seniors at Laurelhurst Village.

Feeding the Hungry

Fourth grade sold **163** Mission: Hungry Helping Packs and processed **14,000** pounds of carrots for and donated **\$819** to Oregon Food Bank

Kids Helping Kids

Fifth grade collected **250** warm wear items to Northwest Children's Outreach for children of low-income families and **800** articles of clothing and toys to Project Lemonade, benefitting local foster youth

Friend-to-Friend Program

Sixth grade students and their parents spent **515** hours visiting with friends at Providence's Center for Medically Fragile Children

Called to Discipleship

Seventh grade gave **496** hours of service, donated **\$3,413** and collected **61 bags** of donated items for **17** agencies or projects that included: Crib Project, Free Geek, Providence Easter Party, Catholic Relief Services Lenten Rice Bowl Project, Our Families in India, Save the Bees, Oregon Humane Society, Foster Care Duffel Pack Foundation, Town Center Village, Help the Homeless, Urban League, Clay Street Table, Seneca House, Night Strike, graffiti removal and anti-bullying



Stewards of the School

Eighth grade gathered **5,000** cans for St. Vincent de Paul to support low-income families in the area

All grades and their families made over **450** lunches for women in the Catholic Charities Housing Transitions Program; raised **\$10,000** for Cystic Fibrosis research; sponsored **two six-member** families from Iraq and Myanmar through Catholic Charities, providing clothing and household items; and supported a Congolese refugee family comprising **four** adults and **15** children with clothing, household items, backpacks and school supplies
