

INTRODUCTION

Starting April 19th, ALL students can attend in-person instruction 5 days a week.

On March 22, the Oregon Department of Education updated their guidelines for schools, removing the required 35 square feet per person and changing the 6 feet distance to 3 feet distance in the classroom.

This new change allows us to bring more students into the school. We base our decisions on the guidelines set out by Oregon Health Authority (OHA), Oregon Department of Education (ODE) and the Centers of Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). We continually review the guidelines and make adjustments when they are updated.

Please note: We understand the concern that families may have about sending their children back into the classroom, so there will still be a Distance Learning option, and at any time, a student may switch from participating in-person to Distance Learning.



When Multnomah County enters higher risk levels, does that change what schools can do?

No, we use the metrics set out by ODE. Schools are considered in the green zone during Multnomah County's high-risk level and can offer all in-person instruction, at this time. If the case counts continue to increase and the test positivity rate increases, we will make adjustments.

^{*}Schools should not reduce in-person instruction or revert to CDL based on county metrics if the school can demonstrate the ability to limit transmission in the school environment. When county trends increase to a new tier on this chart (green-to-yellow or yellow-to-red), pausing expansion of additional in-person learning and maintaining access to current in-person learning for schools that have it in place is recommended.

If schools have met the requirements and begun operating, and then metrics move to a more restrictive threshold (yellow or red), schools are not required to shift from operating with 3 feet of physical distance to 6 feet of physical distance.

A Local Public Health Authority (LPHA), in partnership with the school and district leadership, may call for a shift in physical distancing requirements, including in response to an outbreak or transmission⁴ within the school.


What are the protocols for someone who tests positive for COVID-19, or has been in contact with someone who tests positive?

It is vital that families contact the school. If you have received a positive test, been exposed to, or are exhibiting symptoms of Covid-19, contact the principal to be guided through the next steps according to the Exclusion Summary Chart for Covid-19. It's critical that we learn of exposures as soon as possible to prevent spread within the school. Your information will be treated with sensitivity and confidentiality.

If your child or family member has any symptoms of illness keep your child at home. We need everyone to commit to this protocol to ensure the health and safety of our students, families, our faculty/staff and their families, as well as the greater community. If your child will be absent/not participating in instruction, always contact the school office and your classroom teacher.

If there is an outbreak at the school, will we go back to all DL, or just that homeroom?

This is dependent on the exposure. We follow the guidelines listed in The Planning for Covid-19 Scenarios in Schools.

Can we opt to continue hybrid instruction?

Beginning April 19th, we will offer families two options: You can choose to remain in DL or attend in-person, 5 days a week. We will not have a hybrid option, and there will no longer be color cohorts. Students will be with their homerooms, and middle school groups.

Can a student opt to be in-person from DL at anytime?

After April 19th, a DL student may opt in on May 10th.

What does lunch look like?

Lunch will be outside weather permitting. Students will still be 6' apart at lunch. Individual face shields will be provided for students when they must eat inside.

How does recess work?

Recess schedules have been adjusted to accommodate the larger classes. Each class is assigned a different area of the playground for recess and classes may not mix. Recess equipment is available and is sanitized each day.

Can my child bring their own equipment?

Not at this time. All equipment is provided by the school.

How will Mass work?

Mass will continue to be streamed. Classes will attend Mass in-person by grade level with the exception of PreK, K and 1, who will have Mass together. Students will be spread out in the church in every other pew with at least a minimum of 3' of distance. All students will remain masked during Mass. Father will come them for a blessing or communion. Students will not move.

The church can hold 300 people, and we are limiting it by class to provide more space and smaller groups. They are permitted to sing but there will not be choir. Students will use hand sanitizer as they enter and exit. Mass will continue to start at 8:30 AM each Wednesday. Classes not attending Mass in-person will have the option to stream the Mass or focus on another subject.

What does Wednesday look like?

- Students arrive from 8:00-8:20 AM.
- Mass will continue to be streamed at 8:30 AM on Wednesdays.
- Middle school students will continue with their regular schedule of classes on Wednesdays.
- PreK-5th grade teachers are finalizing their schedules and will share them with their classes prior to April 19th.
- Each class has a 15-minute snack and 15-minute recess break on Wednesdays.
- There is no lunch on Wednesdays.
- Mr. Myers will continue to livestream his Principal's Message at 11:45 and Mr. McHugh will end our day with a streaming Mindfulness Moment.
- Students will be dismissed at 12:00 PM for car line or to walk home.

Will Wednesday exchange occur for DL students?

For those students remaining in DL, Wednesday exchange will occur from 1PM-6PM.

Will we still have car line for drop-off and pick-up?

Yes, car line is going extremely well. With more students it will take a little longer and we appreciate your patience as we safely get students in and out of their cars.

What about specials?

With the exception of PE, specialists will continue to go to the classrooms. Specials will go back to twice a week for ALL students.

If my child is going to miss a day, whom should I contact?

What is the procedure if my child is going to be late or needs to leave early?

Please contact the office and your homeroom teacher. Call the office when you arrive to pick up your child and we will bring your child to you.

Do students switch classrooms?

Teachers move to each class.

Will classes continue to be available on Zoom?

Teachers will Zoom only if there is a student in DL.
